Juvenile Court Administrator, San Juan County

Ms. Linnea Anderson serves as the Juvenile Court Administrator for San Juan County. Ms. Anderson has worked in the field of juvenile justice for the past 21 years. Prior to her appointment as administrator in 2016, she served as juvenile probation counselor, worked for the Washington State Juvenile Rehabilitation Administration in both community and institutional programs and was a founding member/staffer of Gateways for Incarcerated Youth, a non-profit at The Evergreen State College.

In addition to Juvenile Court Services, Ms. Anderson manages the day-to-day operations of the San Juan County Volunteer Guardian ad Litem Program, the Public Defender Screening Program, and the Courthouse Facilitator Program.

Ms. Anderson serves as an officer on the Executive Board of the Washington Association of Juvenile Court Administrators (WAJCA). She is the co-chair of the WAJCA Strategic Planning & Education Committee and serves as a member of the WAJCA Legislative and Finance Committees. Ms. Anderson has been appointed to the Washington State Board for Judicial Administration Court Education Committee and C19 Court Recovery Taskforce where she chairs the Child Welfare Committee and co-chairs the Juvenile Criminal and Juvenile Civil Subcommittee.

Ms. Anderson coordinates the San Juan County Child Welfare Table of Ten, serves on the San Juan County Law and Justice Council, the San Juan County Trial Court Coordinating Committee, and the Courthouse Safety Committee.

Ms. Anderson holds a B.A. from The Evergreen State College.

Ms. Anderson and her husband's families have been close friends for more than fifty years. His family has lived on Shaw Island on their farm since the 1953. They have fond memories of spending time in the islands and on the farm. Together, they dreamed of one day relocating to the San Juan to raise their family. They live on San Juan Island with their two daughters.
