With your consent, I would then ask you to provide about 1-1.5 hours of your free time for an audiotaped, face-to-face interview. The interview will consist of open-ended questions about childhood/ family experiences, past/current relationships and activities, school/workplace experiences, and views on identity, family and culture. The interview will be scheduled at a time and place that is most convenient for you. If you are available, I may also get in touch with you to cover any follow-up questions, although you are free to decline at any stage of the research. Other than potential discomfort in answering these questions, risks will be minimal, given these interviews are strictly voluntary and confidential and interview questions are open-ended. You will be given a choice of either \$15 or a \$15 Barnes & Nobles gift certificate as a token of appreciation for your participation.
